Program Phases or How does it work?

About

Branded as "Newark Shoppes", is a community storefront initiative launched by the City of Newark as the first city-sponsored retail incubator space to help startup retail and service-oriented businesses in Newark, NJ. In 2015, the Newark Community Economic Development Corporation (Newark CEDC) launched its first community storefront as part of Mayor Ras J. Baraka's vision to empower and provide Newark residents the opportunity to start their own business and spur economic development activities throughout the City's all five wards.

Since then, the Newark CEDC has opened five shared retail store-fronts that removes the barriers for provide Newark entrepreneurs low-cost space, business services, training, professional-field specific mentors, and networking opportunities. The Community Store-front Program provides approximately 10 workspaces in each storefront and is operated by the Newark CEDC.

Entrepreneurial Training

Entrepreneurs undergo an intensive 12-16 week "boot-camp" training program provided by Newark CEDC's training partners Rising Tide Capital or the Institute for Entrepreneurial Leadership. The training strengthens their business acumen, provides the skills necessary to launch, market and sell their products. Topics include financial literacy, bookkeeping, corporate infrastructure, insurance, leases, contracts, and more.

Opening Shop

Upon program completion, our ready-for-business entrepreneurs move into a shared retail storefront that is set up "flea market style" allowing each to sell their goods/services to the general public. This innovative program provides Newark residents with the opportunity to combine classroom instruction with hands-on retailing, practical training and thus, gain the experience necessary to build and grow a retail business.

Local Economic Impact



- \$98,000 Average cost to open a traditional independent storefront vs.
 \$1,000 Average cost for inventory as a participant.**
